Dear Congresswoman Napolitano,

On behalf of the National Hispanic Medical Association (NHMA), representing the interests of 50,000 Hispanic physicians in the United States committed to improve the health of Hispanics and other underserved, I am writing to strongly support *H.R. 1109, Mental Health Services for Students Act of 2019*. In particular, we support that the bill that would enhance much needed mental health services for students, if needed to be a more productive, by doing the following:

- Provide comprehensive staff development for educators and community service personnel;
- Support and create services that are culturally and linguistically appropriate; and
- Assist local communities to develop policies to address the impact of trauma, including violence, on the mental health of children and adolescents;

This bill would address the critical need for mental health services in our communities. Suicide is the 10<sup>th</sup> leading cause of death for all ages in the United States and it serves as a major contributor to premature mortality since it ranks as second in age groups 10-14 and 15-19.<sup>1</sup> However, of 3.1 million adolescents aged 12 to 17 with a major depressive episode, only 1.2 million youths, or 41%, received treatment.<sup>2</sup> Additionally, 88% of Latino children and youth have "unmet mental health needs" compared to heir African-American (77%) and White (76%) counterparts.<sup>3</sup>
