



Case and Vaccination Rates by States/County

- In CA, Imperial County and San Joaquin County have large populations of Hispanics. When comparing the two, 37.5% of Hispanics are fully vaccinated in San Joaquin county with 54.8% unvaccinated, while Imperial County has 70.9% fully vaccinated with 20.4% are unvaccinated (National Library of Medicine).
- With a 79.9% Hispanic population, Mora County, NM has a vaccination rate of 57.57%, while Hispanics make up 71.4% of the population in Rio Arriba, NM and have a vaccination rate of 68.87%. (Springfield News Leader)
- In CO, Otero County and Adams County both have Hispanic populations of over 33% with Otero holding a vaccination rate of 49.60% and Adams holding a vaccination rate of 71.69% (Springfield News Leader).





- Over 35,000 COVID-19 vaccine doses have been administered to farmworkers at their workplace since 2021.
