NHMA INSIGHTS



- As of March 2023, vaccination coverage for different racial and ethnic groups indicates disparities. In the 2022-2023 influenza season, White, non-Hispanic (NH) adults had a coverage rate of 52.8%, which is notably 17.6 percentage points greater than that of Hispanic adults at 35.2%.¹
- From 2011-2020, Hispanic adults with cardiovascular disease were 23% less likely to get the annual flu shot compared to non-Hispanic white adults with cardiovascular disease.²
- Older Hispanic adults tend to live in multi-generational homes and spend a lot of time with family members who go to work or school, increasing their risk of exposure to COVID-19 and other infections.³

RSV Prevention Measures and Maternal Vaccine Approval

- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) have endorsed several preventive measures against respiratory syncytial virus (RSV).
 - These measures include recommending a vaccine for individuals aged 60 and above, and endorsing a monoclonal antibody treatment for infants in their first RSV season and at-risk toddlers in their second RSV season.
 - *Two monoclonal antibody products – nirsevimab (Beyfortus) and palivizumab (Synagis)*
- A maternal vaccine named Abrysvo obtained regulatory approval on August 22, 2023.
 - Abrysvo is aimed at preventing RSV in infants through active immunization of pregnant individuals at gestational ages of 32 to 36 weeks.



CDC’s RESP-NET Interactive Dashboard

- The Respiratory Virus Hospitalization Surveillance Network (RESP-NET) operates three platforms for tracking COVID-19, Influenza, and Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) hospitalizations in children and adults.



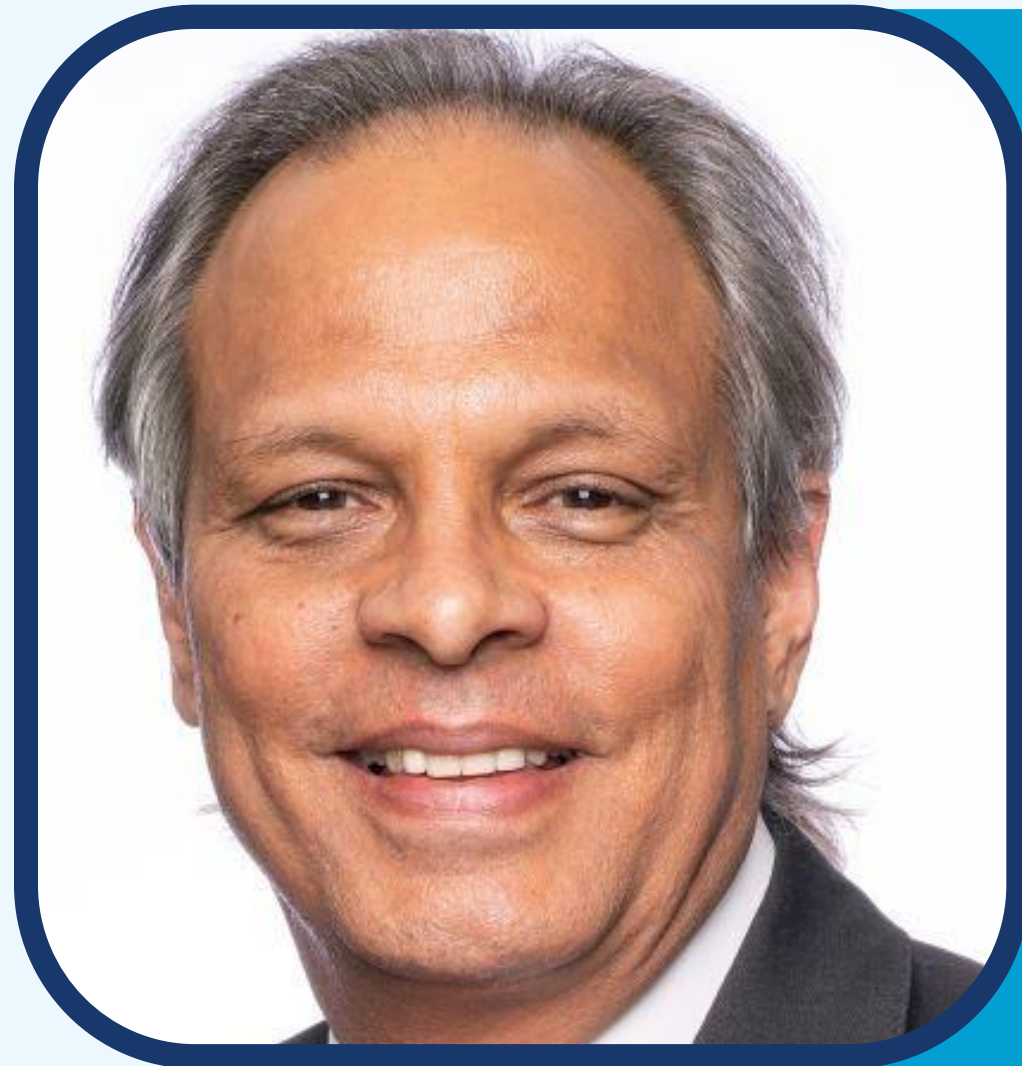

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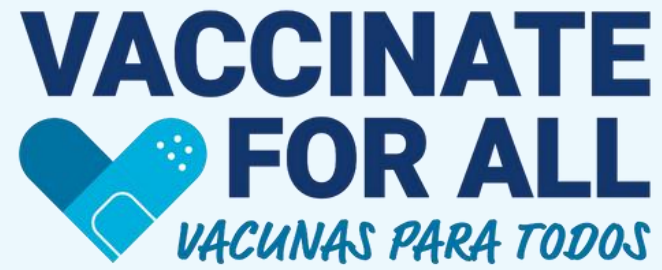

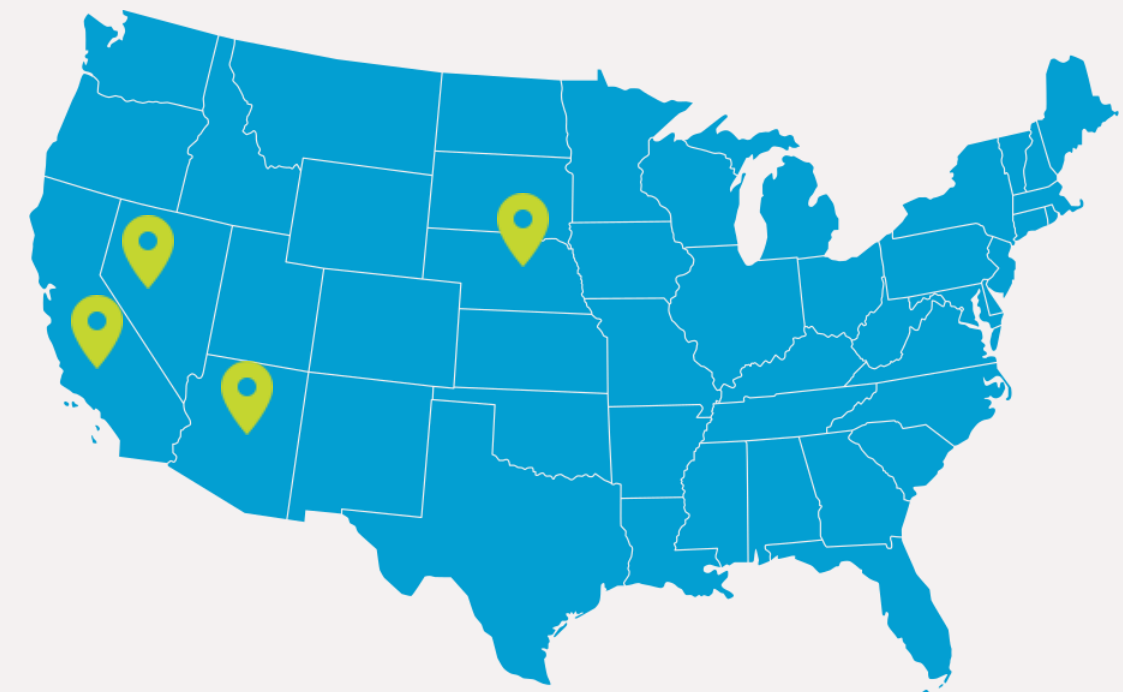
