

Hispanic Leadership Development Fellowship FAQs

Applying

- What is required to apply for the fellowship?
 - Be a current graduate student or have a graduation date from a Master's program within 2 years
 - Strong interest in working in HHS
 - Ability to relocate to Washington, D.C
 - Eligible to work in the United States
 - Must be a current NHMA Member (Student membership \$20)
- Do I need to be a U.S. citizen to apply for the fellowship program?
 - No, but, you must be eligible to work in the United States to apply for the fellowship.
- What if I have problems with the fellowship application site?
 - If you experience issues with the application, please contact Maegan Samuel (<u>msamuel@nhmamd.org</u>).
- When will I be notified about my application?
 - Candidates will be notified the week of May 13, 2024.

Logistics

- How long is the fellowship?
 - The fellowship is 9-months.
- What are the program dates for the 2024-2025 fellowship?
 - September 1, 2024-May 30, 2025
- When would I need to be in Washington, D.C. by?
 - NHMA recommends that you arrive in DC the week of August 26.
- Does this fellowship offer remote work if I am unable to relocate to Washington, D.C?
 - No. This is an in-person fellowship. Although some host sites may allow for telework opportunities, you are expected to relocate to the DC area.
- How many fellowship positions are available?
 - NHMA has 10 slots.



- Does this fellowship provide housing? Or Salary?
 - NHMA will not provide housing. Fellows are responsible for securing housing for the 9-month fellowship. NHMA will offer resources and support to assist fellows in finding housing.
 - Fellows will be paid a salary of \$52,500 for the duration of the fellowship.
 - Funding for housing costs will be provided via the stipend.
- Can fellows room together during the fellowship?
 - Yes. NHMA encourages the fellows to room together, although co-ed roommate situations is not permitted.
- Will NHMA cover travel costs to and from Washington, D.C?
 - Yes. NHMA will cover relocation costs (up to \$575) associated with one round trip to and from the DC area. .
- Will I be provided health insurance?
 - Yes, NHMA will provide fellows health insurance for 9 months.
- Am I allowed to request days off or sick leave?
 - Yes. You can request time off during the fellowship. First, notify your host site you are requesting time off and obtain approval following the call-out procedures in place. After receiving approval from the host site, notify NHMA of the date(s).

About the Fellowship

- Will I be a full time federal employee?
 - Although you will receive government issued items, you will not be considered a full-time federal employee, but a NHMA Contractor.
- If I am not accepted, am I eligible to apply again for the next cohort?
 - Yes. You are able to apply again. The next application period will open November 2024.
- What is the time commitment during the program?
 - Fellows are expected to be at their host sites 5 days a week for 8 hours a day.
 - Fellows are expected to participate in two (2) hours, weekly, of experiential learning.
- What are some Host Sites that fellows were placed in the past?



- Office of Climate Change & Health Equity; Immediate Office of the Assistant Secretary for Health; Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA); Office of Population Affairs.
- Do I get to choose my own Host Site?
 - No. Although you are not able to select your host site you will have the opportunity to list your preferences. Your preferences will be taken into consideration during the matching process.
- Can I switch my Host Site if I do not like my placement?
 - There is no guarantee that you will be able to switch your host site and NHMA strongly recommends against this action.
- How does the program choose my Host Site?
 - Fellows are paired with a host site based on the fellow's public health goals and interests, current/previous work experience, and academic background. The host site's needs and proposed projects will be also taken into consideration.
- When will I be able to begin my placement after a match is made?
 - Candidates will need to undergo a background investigation prior to beginning a placement at an HHS host site. The timeframe for the process varies by Office/Agency.
